

PAN-CAUCASIAN YOUTH ORCHESTRA

The PCYO is the leading professional training orchestra of the Caucasus region. It was created in 2019 for the first edition of the Tsinandali Festival and it is a full symphony orchestra led by Music Director Maestro Gianandrea Noseda.

Every year live auditions are held to select the most talented and ambitious musicians between 18 and 28 years of age and born in one of the Caucasus countries Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Moldova, Turkey, Turkmenistan and Ukraine.

The PCYO is an essential part of the Tsinandali Festival in Georgia. During the Festival period in September, the musicians are given the opportunity to play four or five concerts with world-leading conductors and soloist. Before that, they experience an intense two-week preparation period with coaches from first class international symphony orchestras.

This orchestra is meant to add a musical and personal experience of immense value to the career of the young musicians. The concerts they play are of the highest professional level. Throughout the Festival period, the orchestra members have the possibility to attend rehearsals of other concerts and be in exchange with most famous artist of all genres.

For the participation at auditions and in the orchestra, no fee needs to be paid by the young musicians. The Tsinandali Festival covers all costs for tuition, accommodation, and meals.
